Legal Entitlement to Birth and Death Records for Clerks of Court

Who may purchase a certified copy of a Louisiana Birth Certificate:

Yourself:

Registrant (person named on the certificate)

Immediate Family:

- Current legal spouse of person named on the certificate (spouse <u>must</u> be listed on death certificate as surviving spouse)
- Brother or sister of person named on the certificate
- Mother or father of person named on the certificate
- Grandchild of person named on the certificate
- **Grandparent** of person named on the certificate
- Legal Guardian of person named on the certificate*

*Legal guardian must provide a **judgment of custody**. Custody by mandate or provisional custody from a notary is unacceptable. Transfer of custody witnessed by a notary is unacceptable. Custody expires at age 18.

Who may purchase a certified copy of a Louisiana Death Certificate:

- Immediate Family (Listed above)
- Funeral Directors may request additional copies of a Death Certificate on behalf of surviving immediate family members within one year of the date of death.

A non-family member may request a certified copy of a certificate on behalf of an entitled individual with a letter of authorization that names the authorized individual and provides the person named on the certificate's name and date of birth. A copy of a state drivers' license or state ID for the entitled individual is required.

LSA R.S. 40:61 a fine of not more than <u>ten thousand dollars</u> or imprisonment of not more than <u>five years</u> or both shall be imposed on any person who willfully and knowingly makes any false statement on any application for a certified copy of a vital record.
